Gorilla Glue

Several years ago for Christmas, my mom gave me a fillet knife that quickly became my go-to kitchen knife. It's great for its intended purpose, but the 5-inch blade is so sharp and versatile I use it for everything from removing silver skin from backstraps to butterfly-flying shrimp to slicing garlic like Paulie did in "GoodFellas." Last summer, the blade worked free of the handle, which turned out to be more of an annoyance than a problem — until I tried to fix it. A half dozen attempts, with three different brands of "super" glues, failed to secure the stainless steel tang inside the wood handle. Gorilla Glue, which, according to its manufacturer, "glues hundreds of materials, thousands of combinations," did the job on the first try. Later, I used Gorilla Glue to reattach a ceramic tile to a plaster wall in my bathroom, to secure the aluminum inserts inside the graphite shafts of the arrows I hunt with, and to repair the broken plastic antlers on my 3-D deer target. The last job wasn't necessary, but after seeing how well Gorilla Glue worked, I started looking around for any possible reason to use it.
